The role of nongovernmental organizations working in harm reduction in helping women who use drugs and in improving the quality of services in public shelters and psychosocial centers

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## NGO as a link: client - shelter

- Counseling in harm reduction programs (identification of violence, "emergency suitcase", referral, WINGS program, women's outreach routes, safe place for women).
- Counseling within the public health center (the topic of combating violence is included in the list of recommended consultations).
- Establishment of services (shelters) and referral to your own friendly services.
- $Establishing\ and\ maintaining\ a\ minimum\ threshold\ for\ admission.$
- Extension of the practice to other regions and NGOs.

- Lack of training for service providers at harm reduction programs and Public Health Centers. Responsibilities do include counseling on combating violence, but there is no training.
- Lack of a referral system at harm reduction programs and single referrals.
- Work with abusers (programs exclude the possibility of working with abusers in drug / alcohol intoxication).

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## NGO as a practice of service provision and increase of quality of services

- Creation of services = a unique experience that we can share. Internships, counseling, mutual referral.
- Advocacy for amendments in provision of shelters of the Ministry of Social Policy (2018), elimination of discriminatory provisions in 8 shelters of Ukraine, collection of support letters, inquiries, negotiations on the exclusion of the norm "we do not accept women intoxicated with alcohol or drugs".
- $\label{lem:experience} Experience\ exchange-a\ platform\ for\ service\ providers\ from\ shelters,\ centers\ of\ social\ and\ psychological\ assistance.$
- Providing supervision work with cases involving women who use drugs Conducting training webinars for service providers.
- Provision of first aid kits and naloxone.

- $Weak \ support \ from \ state \ structures \ to \ service \ providers \ for \ experience \ exchange \ activities.$
- Only fragmented support from donors, local authorities. Lack of systemic assistance.
- The main document on shelters the Regulations the shelters has not been changed.
